

PSME Lending Library




The Pastelists Year: Painting the four seasons in Pastel by Elizabeth Mowry


Daniel Greene: Pastel Portrait – Jim Video Length: 2 Hours, 30 Minutes

Plein Air with Pastel by Greg Biolchini, PSA

Greg shares with you his tremendous knowledge and award- winning experience in outdoor, on- location painting. Included is Gregory's technique for using pastel as both a wet

and dry medium. Regarding pastel as an ideal painting medium for wet and dry technique, Greg says, "It is easy to master and it is convenient. Even a beginning student can use pastel as a wash effectively. More accomplished artists may be pleasantly surprised at how pastel over wash can expand their technical skills." Greg's willingness to share his wealth of information surpasses that of many college professors. Subjects covered on this highly informative DVD are value control, building layer on layer with both a wet and dry technique, a start-to-finish demonstration of painting in the field, an exhibition of other pastel paintings by Greg, and an informative section on framing a pastel.


Three one and a half hour **virtual** classes will be held weekly and will

include exercises and tools to help stoke our creative fire.

The last class will be a demonstration incorporating all from the first two. The fee for the three classes is **\$60**. Our creative fire is ignited by the use of memory, passion and imagination that incorporate who we are, our very spirits, within our work.

We will use drawing as a way to get closer to our subject, utilizing tools such as breath, sound, music, writing, visualization, and a response to nature as further means of awakening our creativity.

We will delve into personal stories, life experiences and real life learning to explore how we can incorporate body, mind, emotion and our total being into our work to give it life.

Claudette a retired RN, Expressive Art Therapist, BFA and MA has been working to incorporate the medical with the arts in her paintings. What propelled her to start teaching these classes is what is going on in the world today. Many of the tools not only stoke creativity but help us deal with the anxiety, fear and depression many are experiencing today. If students are interested after taking the basic course, the 3 classes, 1 1/2 hr. classes will be held every 2 weeks to immerse in different art movements, learning new skills dealing with them but also incorporating the tools, design, composition, color and value. The fee for **each** of these sessions is \$10. An offering of four of these
